

Pulaski Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court: Dress and Conduct Code

The following dress and conduct code applies to all persons entering the Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court Courtroom. This is a commonsense dress code, and it is intended to promote respect for the Court and all participants. If you violate this dress code, the Bailiff will not allow you to enter the Courtroom.

1. You must dress appropriately for all Court appearances. The following are examples of inappropriate clothing: shorts, tanktops, cutoffs, halter tops, dirty clothing, clothing with disrespectful language or images, or clothing that is too revealing or shows your underwear.
2. Please remove your hat and sunglasses before you enter the Courtroom.
3. No food, drink, or gum is allowed in the Courtroom.
4. Cell phones are not permitted in the Courtroom. If your cell phone contains information relevant to your case, notify the Bailiff. The Court will then decide whether to allow the cell phone.
5. No children are allowed in the Courtroom – unless they are witnesses or parties. Neither the Clerk nor the Bailiff will watch your children for you.
6. Most proceedings in this Court are closed to the public. The Bailiff will only allow admission to parties and those expressly permitted by the Court.
